
INVITATION

Located in southern Washington, the Klickitat Canyon Working Forest conservation easement project would protect 5.2 miles of the Klickitat Wild & Scenic River, including critical habitat on both sides of the River, link lands protected by Washington Department of Natural Resources and Yakama Indian Nation, and complement the other public lands in close proximity: Conboy National Wildlife Refuge, Gifford Pinchot National Forest, Mount Adams Wilderness and Columbia Gorge National Scenic Area. This diverse and productive forest has been in industrial timberland management for over 70 years and is critically important to the local economy as one of only a handful of non-public land owners that can supply local mills. The property also contains a sensational river canyon, Cascade mountain views and plentiful recreational opportunities. We hope you will join our tour to learn more about this top-ranked Forest Legacy Project candidate and priority conservation area.
